### *The Ogress and the Orphans* 🐉

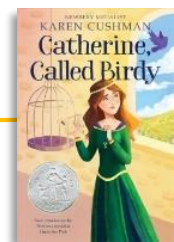
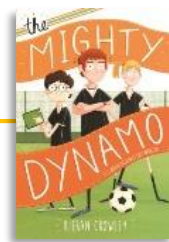
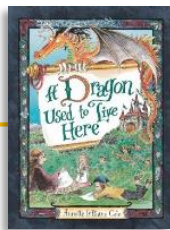

### **The 21 Balloons** 🏠 🚲 🐼

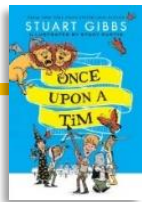
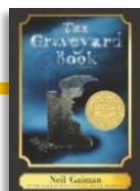
**William Pene DuBois**

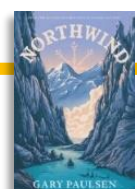
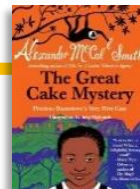
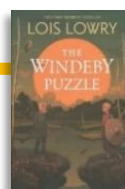
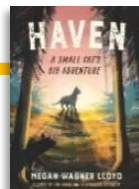
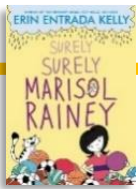
**Uma Krishnaswami**

**Hoboken Chicken Emergency** ☺ 🧐 📺**Daniel Pinkwater**

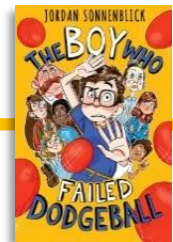
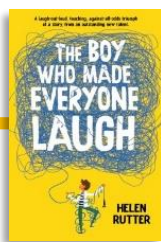
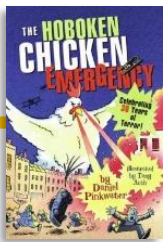

### **The Mysterious Benedict Society** 🕵️ 🔍 \*

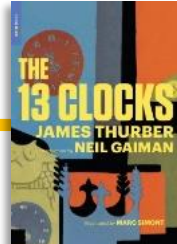
**Trenton Lee Stewart**

**collected and edited by Colleen AF Venable**

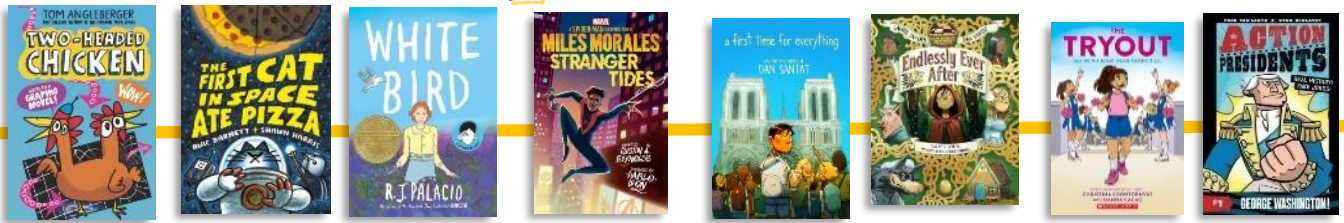
The first of a new series featuring wacky, silly school stories. Great for when you want to read, but just not a long book!

**Christina Soontornvat, illus. by Joanna Cacao**

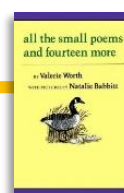
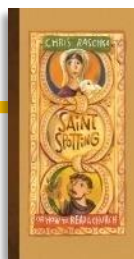
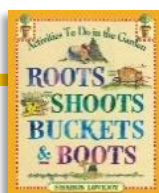
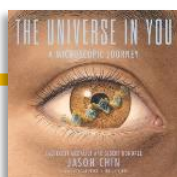
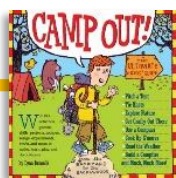

## **All the Small Poems and Fourteen More**

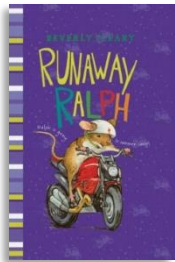
**Valerie Worth**

**\*\*FOR ALL BOOKS: the covers may vary, but the inside is the same.**

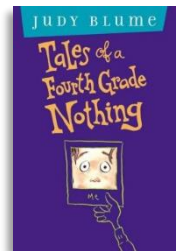

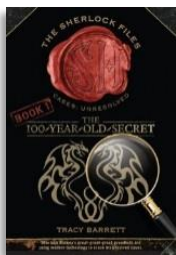
